- ☞ Size:
Depends on the yarn and hook sizes you are using, approximately 4.5 cm/ 1.75".
- ☞ Skill level:
Beginner.
You should be familiar with crocheting in rounds and basic stitches.
There are no basic crochet tutorials included.
- ☞ Copyright :
Do not redistribute, resell and/or translate pattern into another language for reselling, including publishing in the Internet. Do not sell the finished product on the Internet

Important Note:

- ☞ Please read the graphic chart counter-clockwise.
- ☞ The remaining project will be worked in continuous rounds, so you may wish to use a marker to keep track of your rounds.
- ☞ Red dot indicates the first chain.
- ☞ **Continue crochet counter-clockwise, do not turn the inside out at the end of the project**

Pattern

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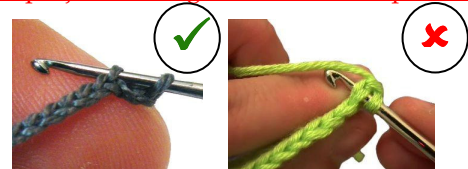
Materials:

- ☞ 3 colors of yarn (#10): red, white and blue
- ☞ Crochet hook, size 1 mm.
- ☞ Akrilon or other type of fiberfill.
- ☞ Scissors
- ☞ Needle.

Abbreviations and symbols:

- ☞ Ch – chain, symbol O.
- ☞ SC – Single Crochet, X.
- ☞ Rnd – Round.
- ☞ SC Dec – SC Decrease. This is where you join 2 SC, reducing them down to 1 stitch. V
- ☞ SC Inc - SC Increase. Crochet twice into the same stitch. ^
- ☞ St – Stitch.
- ☞ [] (brackets) – used to enclosed a sequence meant to be repeated. After the closing brackets will be the number of times to repeat the instruction.

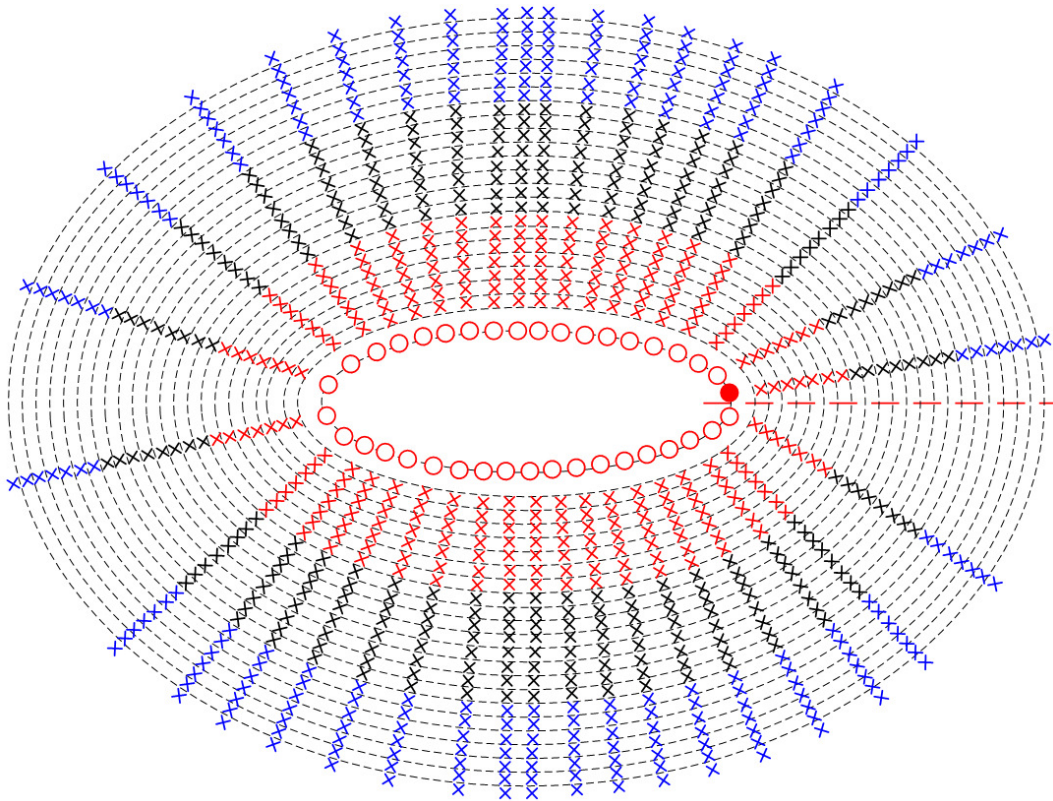
This project is designed for back loop crochet:





Small France Flag:

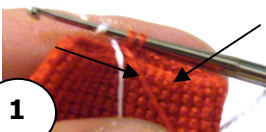
- Start with the red color.
- Read the graphic chart counter-clockwise.
- Red dot indicates the first chain.



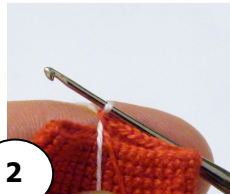
- Rnd 1: Leave a long tail of the red thread. Crochet 38 Ch and join it to the loop by crocheting 1 SC.
- Rnd 2-8 : 1 SC in next 38 SC (8 red rnds).
- Rnd 9 : Change the color to white by following instruction:
 - Insert your hook into the last CS in the row, grab the yarn and draw it through the loop. You should have 2 red loops on your crochet hook.



- Put the red yarn on a working thread. Place the new thread (the white) as close as possible to the last stitch.
- Use the new thread (the white) instead of the previous (the red) thread and crochet 1 SC in the next stitch.



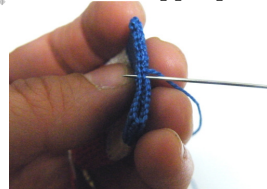
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- Crochet 1 SC in next 37 SC (38 SC in total).
- Rnd 10-16 : 1 SC in next 38 SC (8 white rnds).
- Rnd 17: Change the color to the blue and crochet 1 SC in next 38 SC (38 SC in total)

- Rnd 18-23 : 1 SC of white color in next 38 SC (7 blue rnds).
- Sew the upper part of the flag



- Stuff the flag with fiberfill. Use the back end of crochet hook to reach the edges. Do not make a puffy body, keep it flat.
- Sew the bottom part of the flag Knot and secure the tail of the thread.
- Squeeze the flag a little to spread the fiberfill equally



- Insert the ring



There you go: Vive la France!
