### Introduction:

Ø Size:

Depends on the yarn and hook sizes you are using, approximately 4.5 cm / 1.75".

Ø Skill level:

Beginner.

You should be familiar with crocheting in rounds and basic stitches.

There are no basic crochet tutorials included.

#### This project is designed for back loop crochet:



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# **Small Finland Flag:**

- **@** Start with the white color.
- Read the graphic chart counter-clockwise.

Red dot indicates the first chain.

# Step-by-step detailed tutorial

## Materials:

- Q 2 colors of crochet thread (#10): blue and white.
- @ Crochet hook, size 1 mm.
- Q Akrilon or other type of fiberfill.
- Q Scissors
- @ Needle.

## Abbreviations and symbols:

- $\bigcirc$  Ch chain, symbol **O**.
- SC Single Crochet, X.
- Rnd Round.

## **Important Note:**

- Please read the graphic chart counter-clockwise.
- The remaining project will be worked in continuous rounds, so you may wish to use a marker to keep track of your rounds.
- Red dot indicates the first chain.
- <u>Continue crochet counter-clockwise, do not</u> (<u>turn the inside out at the end of the project</u>)

#### Thank you for using this pattern!

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0 Rnd 1: Leave a long tail of the white thread. Crochet 50 Ch and join it to the loop by crocheting 1 SC.



- 0 Rnd 2 - 6 : 1 SC in next 8 SC, change the thread to the blue and crochet 1 SC in next 3 St. Crochet 28 white SC, 3 blue SC, 8 white SC in each next St.(50 SC total)
- 0 Change the color by following instruction:
- Insert your hook into the first CS in the row, grab the yarn 0 and draw it through the loop. You should have 2 loops on your crochet hook.



- Put the white yarn on a working thread. Place the new thread as close as possible to the last stitch.
- Use the new thread (the blue) instead of the previous (the white) thread and crochet 1 SC in the next stitch.



0 Rnd 7 - 9: 1 SC in next 1 SC, change the thread to the blue and crochet 1 SC in next 48 SC. Change to the white and crochet 1 SC in next 1 SC.(50 SC total)



Rnd 9 - 14 : 1 SC in next 8 SC, change the thread to the blue and 0 crochet 1 SC in next 3 St. Crochet 28 white SC, 3 blue SC, 8 white SC in each next St.(50 SC total)





Sew the upper part of the flag



- Stuff the flag with fiberfill. Use the back end of crochet hook to reach the edges. Do not make a puffy body, keep it flat.
- Sew the bottom part of the flag. Knot and secure the tail of the thread.
- Squeeze the flag a little to spread the fiberfill equally





Insert the ring
